

### Marie Sklodowska- Curie Individual Fellowships (IF)

Individual Fellowships provide opportunities to acquire and transfer new knowledge and to work on research in a European context (EU Member States and Associated Countries) or outside Europe. The scheme particularly supports the return and reintegration of researchers from outside Europe who have previously worked here. It also develops or helps to restart the careers of individual researchers that show great potential, considering their experience.

The submission session for MSCA individual fellowships is now open. The deadline date for this call is 11<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2014. Read more about this call.

#### Swiss partners in Horizon 2020

The European Commission has published the guide on the position of Switzerland with respect to participation in Horizon 2020. A <u>summary by UKRO</u> states that Switzerland 'has to be considered a non-associated country', and thus their participation will be in accordance with the rules governing third country entities.

The German organisation KOWI also <u>offers a newsletter</u> (active information service) in English that can be suited to your particular interests.



WUN has announced the 2014 round of the Research Development Fund (RDF), which offers seed grant up to £15000 to researchers to foster research collaboration across the WUN network. The seed grants support research projects in the four WUN Global Challenges: Climate change, Public health, Global higher education and research, and Understanding cultures.
